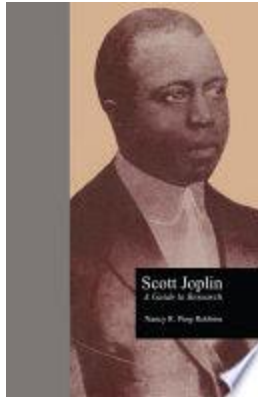


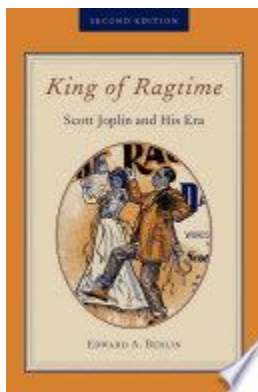

Provides more information on this legendary character in Kansas City, particularly on a painting of him done in 1896. Notes his various appearances at special community events in the 1890s.

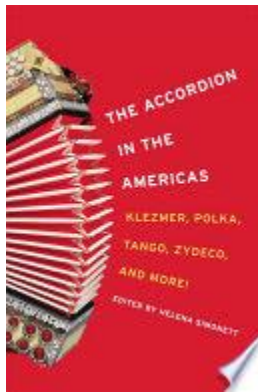

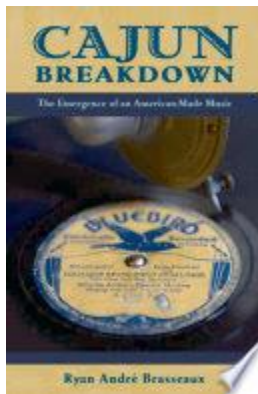
